



Columbia Basin Trust College Community Service Awards Application

Columbia Basin Trust's College Community Service Awards are designed to assist mature students of the Columbia Basin in pursuing post-secondary education/training in the region, and to reward and encourage the volunteerism of Columbia Basin residents. These Community Service Awards are based on volunteer service and are not based on academic achievement. Each year Columbia Basin Trust (CBT) provides a maximum of ten (10) College Community Service Awards valued at \$2,000 each.

Definition: *Community Service refers to a significant contribution of time, energy and/or talent that fosters social, environmental or economic well-being without resulting in a financial benefit to the applicant. Communities also include rural areas of the Basin that are not defined as cities, towns, or villages.*

Eligibility

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be eligible to apply for Columbia Basin Trust College Community Service Award:

- Applicant must not be a graduate from high school in the preceding year of application.
- Applicants must have a minimum of three years continuous residency in CBT's mandate area immediately prior to their application. Students, who might have resided temporarily outside CBT's mandate area for education but retained their permanent address in the Basin, will be deemed as having lived in the Basin.
- Applicants must be planning to enroll in a recognized undergraduate program leading to a degree, diploma or certificate, including trades certification at Selkirk College. Full-time (**80 percent of a full course load**) enrolment in a program that is recognized by the student financial assistance program in British Columbia. Students with recognized disabilities are eligible if they are registered in 60 percent of a full course load.
- Submission of the completed application materials by the deadline to Selkirk College.

Selection

The emphasis for award selection is on active and significant volunteer involvement to foster social, environmental and economic well-being. The adjudication process will give added weight to volunteer activities which are focused on providing benefit to Basin communities but other volunteer activities will be considered. Academic achievement will be considered in the context that a solid academic performance ensures the applicant's ability to successfully complete his or her chosen post-secondary program.

Awards Committee

The Selkirk College Awards committee and a CBT representative will adjudicate the applicants eligibility and award selection.

Application Instructions

1. Student Application
 - Complete the Student Application form. All applications must be typed. Note: you can type in the application form and print the final copy for submission.
2. Essay
 - Complete the student essay, maximum 200 words. It's best to type your essay in a Word document that you can save. Once you are ready (do not forget to spell check and proofread) "cut" and "paste" the text into the essay section of the application form.
3. Attach three Reference Forms and letters completed by your referees.
4. Print, sign and date your completed application.
5. Submit Application
 - Submit all of the above including the Student Application form to the Selkirk College, Development Department. All complete applications must be postmarked no later than **June 30, 2010**. Do not send applications by fax or electronically. Applications sent by fax, electronic means, or postmarked past

the application deadline will not be considered. Letters of reference must be included with the application.
